Preface

Health Care and Health Care Education Opportunities in Nevada – 2005 provides residents, prospective students, and interested parties in Nevada with current information on health care opportunities and health care education programs in Nevada. This booklet is targeted toward high school students, college students, and any individual seeking information on health care employment and training in Nevada.

Table 1 of this volume provides a current list and description of health care education programs in Nevada. The vast majority of these programs are administered on seven of the eight campuses of the University and Community College System of Nevada (UCCSN):

- Community College of Southern Nevada (CCSN) – Las Vegas * www.ccsn.nevada.edu
- Great Basin College (GBC) – Elko * www.gbcnv.edu
- Nevada State College (NSC) – Henderson * www.nsc.nevada.edu
- Truckee Meadows Community College (TMCC) – Reno * www.tmcc.edu
- University of Nevada, Reno (UNR) * www.unr.edu
- University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV) * www.unlv.edu
- Western Nevada Community College (WNCC) – Carson City * www.wncc.nevada.edu

Information on private, non-UCCSN certificate and degree programs, as well as health care education opportunities offered through the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) is also presented.

The health care education programs listed in this volume are organized according to the closest related occupation that program graduates or completers are *typically* employed. In some cases this classification scheme becomes cumbersome since a number of certificate and degree programs prepare individuals for more than one occupation. It is also the case that there are multiple educational paths that prepare students for licensure in a given occupation. For example, students interested in work as a registered nurse can pursue education and training in an associate degree program or a baccalaureate degree program – both types of programs in Nevada prepare students for careers as registered nurses.

It must be stressed that a number of programs listed are actually the first of often multiple steps that an individual must take to become employed in a given occupation. In particular, many of the health care occupations listed in this volume require licensure and/or certification from state agencies and accrediting bodies, not to mention on-the-job training, continuing education (CE), and/or continuing medical education (CME). Despite these limitations, this volume represents an attempt by the High Sierra Area Health Education Center (AHEC) and the Medical Education Council of Nevada (MECON) to provide prospective students and the residents of Nevada with a complete inventory of the growing range of health care education opportunities that currently exist in Nevada.

In this volume, every attempt has been made for this list to be inclusive – that is, in addition to traditional health care occupations such as medicine, nursing, and dentistry, this volume includes information on mental/behavioral health programs, health care administration degree programs, and public health education opportunities.

Table 2 provides current data on estimated employment, job growth, and wages for most health care occupations. This information is based on statewide employment surveys conducted by the Research and Analysis Bureau of the Nevada Department of Employment, Training, and Rehabilitation (DETR) over the past three years. (Some occupations are excluded from these tables for confidentiality reasons and/or because estimated numbers are low.) Tables 2 indicate that most health care occupations will experience modest to robust projected job growth through the end of the decade. The majority of the health care employment growth will take place in the Las Vegas metropolitan area. Nonetheless, steady health care employment growth will continue to take place in the Reno-Sparks-Carson City region and most rural and frontier regions of the state.

In summary, employment in the health care field in Nevada is robust and expanding, and health care education opportunities for residents of Nevada continue to expand in response to the growing demand for health care and health care professionals across Nevada. *Health Care and Health Care Education Opportunities in Nevada – 2005* represents our attempt to comprehensively inventory health care education opportunities in Nevada on an ongoing basis. Missing data or cells marked by “N/A” indicate occupations for whom data has been suppressed by DETR for confidentiality reasons. The job categories in this table do not correspond exactly with those listed in Table 1. The job titles used in this table are those used by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics and DETR.
